Message from Imam Sheikh Hossam Musa

Assalamualaikum My Dear and Precious Community,

I praise Allah SWT and invoke His peace and blessings upon our dear and beloved Prophet Muhammad (pbuh), his family, companions, and followers.

It is imperative to bring attention and awareness to important matters in order to keep our community healthy and strong. Lately, I am seeing a spike in mental health issues, substance abuse, faith crises- especially in teenagers, marital discord, and family problems.

As I interact with our community members, I am often approached for guidance on these matters. Often times, the parents of a teenager say that they had no clue their child was experiencing serious mental health issues or faith crises. But then they are completely surprised when they discover otherwise!

Please try to be more vigilant and aware of your child's mental health and emotional well-being. Don't just assume that since they're not complaining, that there is no issue or problem. Be in touch with them, talk to them, befriend them, converse with them safely, and provide them with the safety, security, affection, and support that they need, especially during these challenging teenage years. Please don't hesitate to educate yourself about mental health and how to deal with mental health issues when they arise. It is a testament to our humanity to have health challenges; mental, emotional, physical, and otherwise. Please don't assume that if I don't have it, it's not that important. Let's increase our awareness and learn together, as a community, how we can address these real, and sometimes serious, challenges. ICGC is offering health seminars through Rahma throughout the year. Please take part in using these seminars, in addition to any and all resources available to you. You owe this to yourself and your family. May Allah SWT bless them and keep them safe and healthy.

While many of us may not be aware, our children are exposed to countless opportunities to use, experiment, and possibly abuse tobacco, drugs and alcohol. Please monitor your children's well-being: talk to them, educate them, instill confidence in them, and advise them to be careful and selective in the quality of friends they choose. Trust, but verify. Show me your friends, and I'll tell you who you are. We are heavily influenced by our friends, peers, and people we hangout with. Talk to specialists in the field of substance abuse and attend the well planned and very important seminars offered this year at ICGC insha'Allah.

Although we do our best to address crises of faith when they unfortunately occur, taking a proactive approach is a much better and much more effective way to avoid serious issues.

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Message from Imam Sheikh Hossam Musa

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Oftentimes, a parent will ask me, "my child is doubting their faith, what do I do!?" I'll ask, "have you put your child in a fulltime Islamic school?" They answer, no. I ask, "have you enrolled them in the youth programs offered at your local Masjid?" They answer no. I ask, "have you enrolled them in the Quran/Hifz program offered by your local Masjid?" They answer no. I ask, "do they go to the Islamic Sunday School?" They usually answer, no, or they attended for just a couple of years. I ask, "do you as a parent take your family, children included, to the weekly lecture at your Masjid, attend national/regional Muslim conventions, go to Umrah, or participate in the educational programs offered by your Masjid/Muslim community?" They sadly answer, no. My next question is, "do you have younger children?" If they say yes, I suggest to the parents that they make some serious changes in their lifestyles, particularly in the way they are raising their children. I remind them to make sincere duas, and then commit to actively participate in the above mentioned programs. It is the most effective way to ensure the rest of their children don't end up in the same place a few years later. Unfortunately, they likely will if families don't change their trajectory.

I can't emphasize how important it is to regularly and continuously participate in all, if not, as many of the programs your local Masjid and Muslim community is offering, especially full time Islamic schools! Being proactive is much more effective! May Allah SWT bless, guide, and protect our children and loved ones.

Insha'Allah, this year we at ICGC and Rahma will be providing programs lead by specialists to help raise awareness and address these very important matters. Our educational programs plan to focus on family and marriage with its many dimensions. Please look forward to these upcoming programs, and please make sure you participate with your precious families. May Allah SWT bless, guide, and protect our families and loved ones



Success@Home served over 500 families by providing Clothing & Household items, Food & Hygiene bags, Rent & Utility Assistance, Transportation Support as well as Legal & Medical Referrals.




