Rewind to 1993—attendees of Eid prayer eagerly recited the Takbeerat while sitting on the ground, which would later become the future home of the Islamic Center of Greater Cincinnati (ICGC). We could never have imagined what was to come. Fast forward to November 1995—the official opening ceremony of ICGC. Alhamdulillah, years of du'as, site design, planning, and fundraising had come to fruition. Allah (SWT) blessed us with an incredible facility and campus.

There is truly something for everyone. But now, we face a challenge—yet it is a beautiful one. Our gorgeous campus, with its stunning architecture, is utilized to full capacity throughout the day. While keeping up with regular maintenance, we also need additional space to accommodate the community's future growth, Insha'Allah.

We must channel the same tawakkul (trust in Allah) that the visionaries of ICGC had—the same tawakkul that the pioneers of INTAC believed in. Allah (SWT) has commanded us to act, strive, and do our best. The results are not in our hands but in the hands of Allah (SWT). At ICGC, we foster a space where the community can live and practice Islam fully. Our goal is to provide the support needed for a fulfilling, faith-driven life.*

At ICGC, we have the honor of serving over 110,000 people annually through a variety of spiritual services, including daily prayers, Jumu'ah, Ramadan Taraweeh, Eid prayers, khawatir, nikkahs, janazahs, shahada, and visitations.

In 2024, we performed nikkahs for 49 couples and provided essential services to 40 families, guiding them through every step of the funeral process—from ghusl to burial—ensuring peace of mind during difficult times.

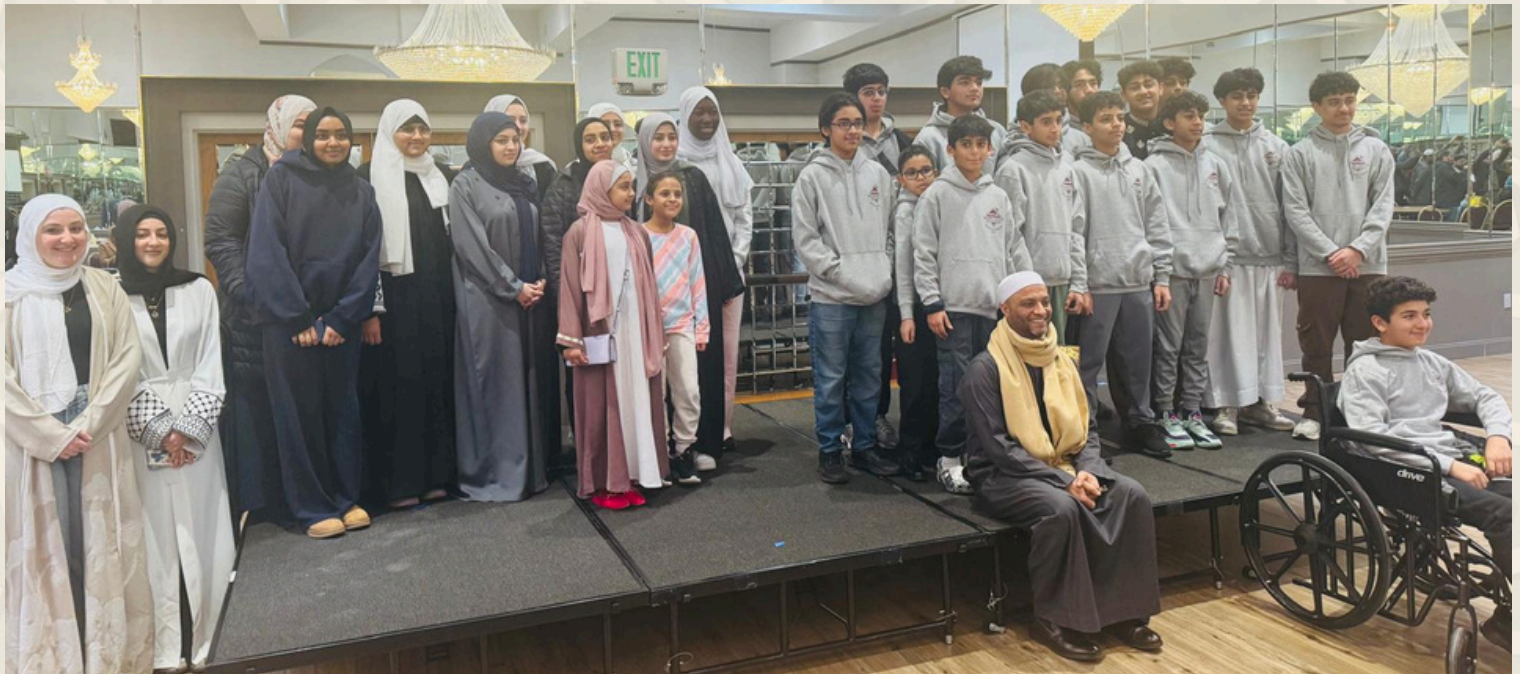
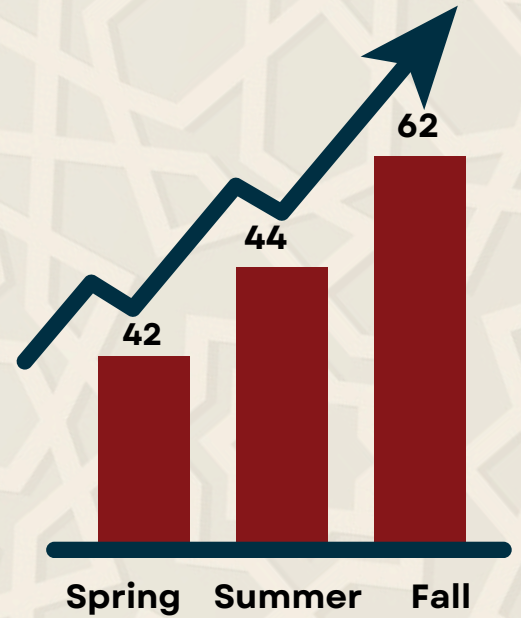
We also prioritize offering divorce arbitration and counseling, which are vital services to the community.

Alhamdulillah, we were blessed to welcome 72 new brothers and sisters into Islam this year, offering them support and resources to help them transition smoothly into their new faith.

Hifz Program

ICGC aspired to create a program and an environment for both our youth and adults to commit to memory the book of Allah (SWT). From this aspiration, we have a growing Hifdh program that where our youth are thriving in Qur'an memorization. In 2024, we had 42 youstudents in the Spring, 44 students in the Summer, and 62 students in the Fall.

On Saturdays, we have an adult Hifdh class that chas ounts 8-10 adult memorizing Qur'an.

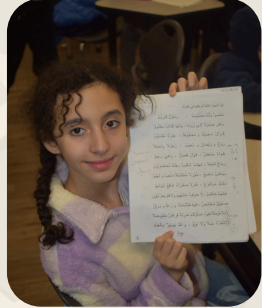
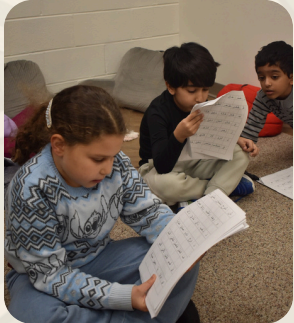
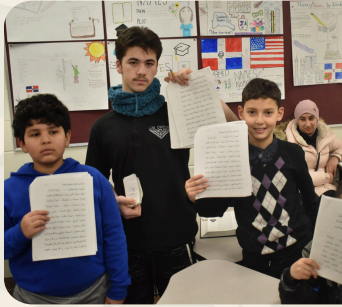


Quran Connections

Highlights of the program:

- For all ages and proficiency levels.
- 15 step program that places you at your level of proficiency.
- At the end of the 12 steps, you will start reading the Quran.
- Last 4 levels to master reading the Quran.
- This can lead to the path for Hifz for those who are interested.

This is a great opportunity for you or your kids to learn how to read the Quran. The program is designed for all levels, even children who are not familiar with the Arabic alphabet. Quran Connection will teach your kids the alphabet until reading the Quran fluently. Program Goal: To motivate, engage and encourage students to continue their learning journey to connect with Allah's holy book.

Outreach

In 2024, the ICGC had significant achievements, including over 700 guests on tours and more than 350 participants in outbound talks through our Outreach team.



ICGC has positioned our itself as a trusted authority on knowledge and information, benefiting students, teachers, and employees alike. In light of the evolving global political landscape and the pressing need to address current events, we remain committed to providing educational initiatives and promoting knowledge within the Cincinnati community throughout 2025, inshallah.

Beyond the numbers, our impact is manifested in the meaningful connections we've established with various institutions, Islamic and non-Islamic, fostering a deeper understanding of our community and correcting misconceptions.



Social Services

Finding Original Creative Unique Solutions

Education

To address the low-income challenge, we piloted the “Success@School” program this year. It supports individuals with the skills and drive to pursue higher education or vocational training in in-demand fields. So far, 15 participants have benefited, with some graduating and others nearing graduation. As their incomes grow, they can plan for a more secure financial future.

Financial Coaching

We continue to support working families with rent and utility assistance during job loss or emergencies, while also helping them prepare for unforeseen circumstances through proactive money management. This year, we piloted a financial coaching program, “Success@Life,” guiding 15 households in budgeting, debt elimination, credit scores, banking, savings, and retirement/investments.



Employment

The Cincinnati/Middletown area has seen unemployment rise from 3.8% in January to 4.9% by midyear, with the Department of Job & Family Services reporting it at 5.1%. Blue-collar jobs, particularly in fast food, restaurants, and general labor, have been heavily impacted by COVID-19. Despite these challenges, our team provided nearly 700 employment services and placed 29 individuals in jobs.



Food Pantry

The pantry served 5,967 individuals (1,425 households) with fresh produce, dairy, bread, canned goods, and hygiene items, providing 53,703 meals across 50 zip codes. During Ramadan, we distributed additional Zakah to 50 vulnerable households (200 individuals) through gift cards for groceries and Eid shopping. A special thanks to the Al-Zahrawat Club for their generous donation of 100 food bags.

Refugee Assistance

39 families have resettled in Cincinnati through referrals from Catholic Charities of SW Ohio and others—25 from the Middle East (mainly Syria), 10 from Asia (mainly Afghanistan), and 3 from Africa. Families receive limited government funds for initial rent and are expected to become self-sufficient within 90 days. Due to barriers like paperwork delays, limited affordable housing, low-wage job opportunities, and language challenges, it typically takes 6 months to a year for families to stabilize. During this time,



ICGC Social Services provides food assistance, rent and utility aid, job search support, and transportation help.

Housing Support

We used a combination of Zakat, Sadaqah and Grant funds to support struggling families financially.

With 220 applications, we assisted families with a total of \$250,000/- paid towards rent, utilities, transportation and education.

For a long time, I have struggled with balancing school, work, and trying to make enough money to pay for my tuition. This summer semester is the first time in a while that I didn’t have to pay out of pocket, and it's all thanks to Project Lift and Leanna from Islamic Center of Greater Cincinnati . Without your help, I am not sure I would still be in school. You have supported me in ways I never thought possible, and for that, I am forever grateful. I’m not sure how I can ever repay you, but please know that your generosity has changed my life. Because of your help, I’m able to focus more on my studies and less on working long hours just to cover my tuition balance. You’ve lifted a huge burden off my shoulders, allowing me to pursue my education with greater dedication and hope for the future. Thank you for investing in me and for believing in my potential. Your support has given me the opportunity to continue my education and move closer to achieving my dreams.

I will always be grateful for everything you’ve done for me.”

ICGC's Youth

The ICGC Youth team is made up of the ICGC Youth Directors, the Youth Board, the Youth Steering Committee, Youth Team Leaders that spearhead programs like the Youth Library, MGTC, Basketball, and Zarawat, and the Youth Counselors. The program also provides support for other youth-related programs and activities directly or through collaborative efforts.

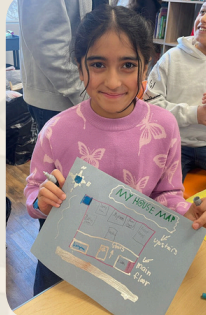
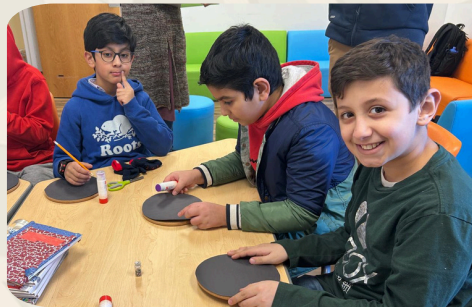
2024-2025 year include a record enrollment of 95 girls, with five teachers and four teacher assistants supporting the program. Sessions are held every two weeks, offering a three-course dinner-salad, main course, and dessert-catered by local Muslim businesses in Cincinnati. Each session is designed to nurture the Islamic identity of the girls through spiritual talks, interactive activities, and peer learning. The goal of these activities is to encourage personal growth, foster connections, and strengthen the sisterhood bond among the participants.

The program was supported by one lead organizer, two adult volunteers, and six youth volunteers, all of whom played a key role in its success. Around 250 different children participated in the programs, with many returning for repeat sessions. Multiple ongoing programs were held each week, providing consistent opportunities for engagement. The focus of these programs was to teach Islamic knowledge and values, incorporating a blend of books and hands-on activities to create an interactive and meaningful learning experience for the participants.

Alzahrawat

A program for girls aged 7-12, offering a fun mix of lectures and activities like art, drama, knitting, and sewing. It aims to strengthen connections to the masjid, build a strong Muslim identity, and encourage positive interactions with people of other faiths.

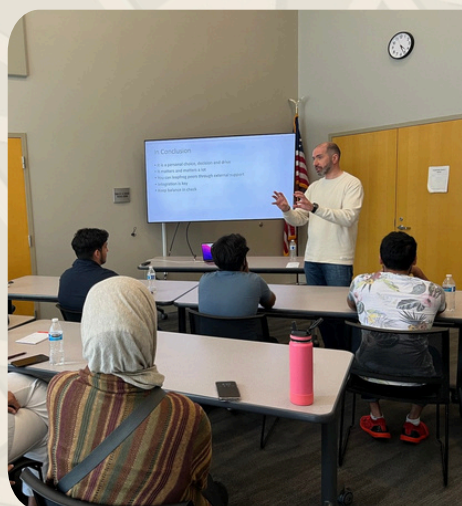
3. Networking Event with Keynote Speaker Representative Munira Abdullahi

Annual Summary
